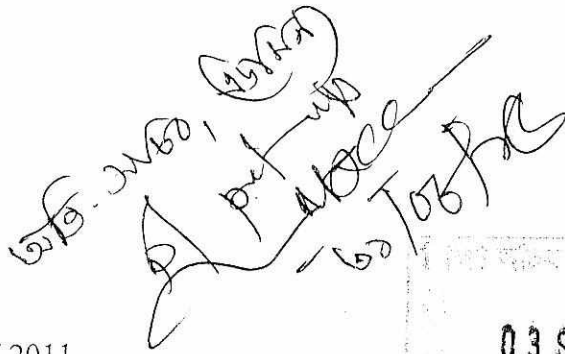

Subject: foreign students are increasing in Japan

- Japanese companies are increasingly hiring foreign students due to demographic decline at one hand and increasing tourists in Japan on the other. The sector that mostly wants foreign labour is retail service. The number of foreign students granted working visas has risen three years in a row to 11,647 in 2013, up from 10,969 in 2012, 8,586 in 2011 and 7,831 in 2010, according to the Immigration Bureau. The 2013 figure was higher than pre-global recession peak of 11,040 in 2008.
 - Central government, local government, and universities are offering different scholarships to foreign students. The central government offers seven types of scholarships for foreign students, ranging from ¥117,000 to ¥242,000 a month, according to the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT). The scholarships vary in duration from one to seven years. All seven also offer tuition and entrance fee exemptions. Students can apply for the scholarship via Japanese embassies or universities.
 - Apart from this, students may come to Japan to learn Japanese language at different language schools and work 28 hours a week. These students can apply also for universities afterwards. Students can directly contact with language school in Japan. For further information about Japanese language schools, attached information may be seen. A few Japanese language schools are also contacting the Mission to inquire about how to start their office in Dhaka to support the interested students in Bangladesh to apply for language schools in Japan.

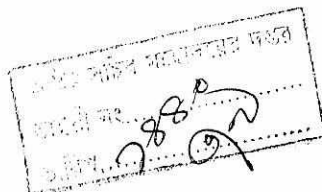

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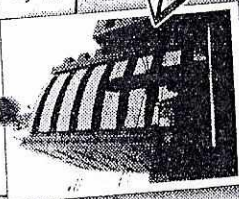

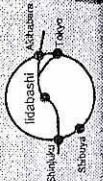
